FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

AmeriCorps Indian Tribes Grants

*Letter of Intent (Optional): April 10, 2019
Application Deadline: May 2, 2019*

AmeriCorps Indian Tribes Grants provide funding to engage AmeriCorps members in evidence-based or evidence-informed interventions to strengthen communities.

Priority areas include:

1. Disaster services: improving community resiliency through disaster preparation, response, recovery, and mitigation
2. Economic opportunity: increasing economic opportunities for communities by engaging opportunity youth, either as the population served and/or as AmeriCorps members, to prepare them for the workforce
3. Education: improving student academic performance in Science, Technology, Engineering, and/or Mathematics (STEM), and/or serving students who attend Bureau of Indian Education schools
4. Healthy futures: reducing and/or preventing substance abuse (including opioids) and suicide
5. Veterans and military families: positively impacting the quality of life of veterans and improving military family strength

Funding: Legal Assistance Enhancement Program

Deadline: April 29, 2019

Administration for Children and Families (ACL) invites applications that seek to achieve

quantifiable and sustainable enhancements that build upon existing programmatic work to increase the effectiveness of legal assistance for older Americans with social or economic need. ACL's new Legal Assistance Enhancement Program (LAEP) will support legal assistance enhancements and innovations for non-profits and Tribal/Indian organizations. Available funding for this opportunity ranges from a minimum of \$100,000 to a maximum of \$250,000 per grant per year, for up to three years depending on the availability of funding.

Orutsararmiut Native Council in Bethel, Alaska participated in the World Elder Abuse Awareness Day on 6/15/18, we had over 20 participants walking with signs during the busy lunch hour. We had representatives from various local people and organizations such as ResCare Homecare (PCA Services), an elder with his family caregivers, 2 Bethel Police officers and 1 community service patrol, ONC Natural Resources, Bethel Legislative Information office, holding signs and raising awareness to prevent elder abuse and exploitation.

We also went on air with the local radio station KYUK on 6/13/18 to increase awareness, and provide public outreach on elder abuse prevention and who to contact to make a report. - Nikki Pollock
