	communities, so we may have first-hand knowledge of families	
	and situations. We may interact with abusers & victims daily.	
	APS workers are usually victim advocates, so it makes sense	
	that the nature of their work could anger families or abusers.	
	How do we provide support to APS workers? How do we	
	protect APS workers during their work or after hours? How do	
	we protect confidentiality of staff, abusers & victims?

The curriculum was developed to guide caregivers in tribal communities and to help define the role of caregivers. Programs could use this curriculum for coordinated training between tribal social service workers, CHRs, Public Health workers, respite workers, seniors, families and communities to build a caregiver network.
