

THE NEW TITLE VI PPR: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

THE TITLE VI PPR HAS CHANGED!

HERE'S A QUICK GUIDE FOR WHAT THAT MEANS FOR YOU.

1. THE REPORTING FORM HAS CHANGED

Beginning April 1, 2020, All Title VI grantees must use the new Program Performance Report (OMB 0985-0007) when recording services for the 4/1/20-3/31/21 grant period. [Download the new form here on olderindians.acl.gov.](#)

2. YOU MAY NEED TO UPDATE YOUR RECORD-KEEPING FORMS OR CLIENT TRACKING SYSTEM

Many of the reporting elements have changed, and so have the definitions of what counts as a unit of service. Before April 1, 2020, make sure your forms reflect these changes by [checking out our "Old PPR vs. New PPR" chart.](#)

3. ACL WILL OFFER TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

For PPR reports due June 30, 2020 (reporting period 4/1/19-3/31/20), you must still use the old form.
